



College staff offer continual support and mentorship throughout the student's studies with regular meetings and supervision to monitor the student's progress and welfare. Students can be 16 when they commence their Murdoch College MUPC or Foundation Studies course. They need to be 17 years of age by the time they progress to their university program.
